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LEONARDO DA VINCI: L'HÔTEL-DIEU DE LYON RECEIVES THE "E-LEARNING IN COMMUNITY CARE" EUROPEAN MEETING

Thursday the 3rd and Friday the 4th of 2009, occurred the first official presentation of the e-learning in community care platform, at Hôtel-Dieu de Lyon, France. This event comes after the "e-learning in community care" project, launched in 2007 by the NCO N ZO of Brno, Czech Republic National Center of Nursing and Health Professions. A public conference about the online training platform, for nurses and midwives, has been done. The results of the tests, gathered during summer 2009, were communicated by the 4 partner countries: Czech Republic, Poland, Slovakia and France.

Set up by MF & Partners Consulting Company, the French partner of the project, this meeting took place inside the historical "Grand Refectoire" of Hôtel-Dieu in Lyon, France. This spacious room has been placed at MF & Partners disposal by the director Paul Castel, President of European Hospitals Directors Association. Florence Adnet-Cavaillé, in charge of International Relations within the Hospices Civils de Lyon, started the conference with an overall presentation of Hospices and Hôtel-Dieu.

After an introduction to the partners and a recap of the project, the conference ended with details of the results of the tests. A very precise and quantified evaluation, based on important pedagogical criteria (comprehensibility, technical preparation...) has been made by each partner country. The meeting got extended to a seminar, on September the 4th, in which Laure Richard Couturier, Technical Director of the Healthcare Executive Training Institute (Hospices Civils), offered the opportunity to the assembly, to discover the inner e-learning platform of Hospices Civils of Lyon.

Marie Marková, coordinator of the "e-learning in community care" project, came up with Czech Republic results, with her colleague, sociologist and health specialist, Professor Sylva Bártlová. Professor Leslaw Niebroj, specialist of ethical issues, presented the results of the Health care and Sanitary Education Faculty of Silesia Medical University in Poland. Professor Zoltan Balogh, teacher at the Computing Department of Constantine Philosopher University, explained the Slovakian results.

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Jérôme Clément, nurse and Executive Director of Formatic Santé Association, tested the platform himself and concluded with a positive opinion that goes hand in hand with the results obtained in other countries (80% of satisfaction rate in the 3 other partner countries on the basis of 30 nurse testers and 30 midwife testers, in each country). This e-learning formation could interest other training and teaching institutions that would be liable to use this community care programs.

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
